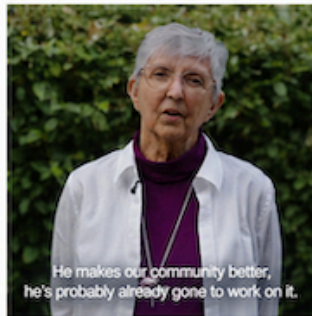

Taking Action

My road safety bill becomes law: My bill – which includes reform on school zone speed cameras, such as requiring radar speed signs, crosswalks in certain locations, and other safety design features (and not just enforcement) IF local gov'ts choose to use these cameras, PLUS revenue reporting – has been signed into law! I'm one of 5 Democrats this year to get a general bill signed into law.



ROAD SAFETY BILL SIGNED INTO LAW

Budget cuts: Cutting tax revenue MUST come with a cut to services – you can't have it both ways – and Gov. Kemp's FY27 budget vetoes eliminated the ENTIRE \$20.7 million the General Assembly (starting with my House Appropriations subcommittee for public safety) appropriated for sexual assault centers, domestic violence service providers, and child advocacy centers. To be clear, not to provide new services, but simply to stay afloat. The following is a SAMPLING of Gov. Kemp's line-item budget vetoes:

- sexual assault/domestic violence/child abuse victims services (\$20.7 million – everything we appropriated to keep them afloat)
- NOW/COMP waiver services for people w/intellectual and developmental disabilities
- colon cancer screenings
- Georgia Memory Net services for persons with dementia
- home and community-based services for elderly
- PFAS removal/remediation
- veteran homelessness services
- offender call monitoring in state prisons
- school safety grants
- school transportation
- vision/hearing screenings in schools
- summer nutrition program in schools (SunBucks)

Tax Revenue Cuts Come at a Price:

Lupton (a survivor herself) and I have fought for over a year particularly for this state funding of victims services providers – especially since the federal funding cuts to these providers, which was already significant in the last few years, but became even worse under the Trump Administration's grant cuts. These providers are closing rapidly; it is a full-blown crisis. And we have pleaded with Republican colleagues that, if you believe the feds should be slashing spending and that states/local control is where it's at, then WE, the state, need to fund these providers, because these enterprises will never be profit-driven. We should provide taxpayer relief – but we should also be honest that, if we pursue it the way the majority party has, it DOES come at a price.

Dear Mr. Huff:

The Trump Administration's demand against Fulton County to access 2020 voting records in that county, United States of America v. Chi Altomare, is another example of authority that the Administration does not have.

In an attempt that all U.S. federal courts, the Administration involves - of all things - the Civil Rights Act of 1960 to force an election that has been

The November 2020 election was, as of the time the Attorney General made its demand on Fulton County, 18 months prior - over 18 months past when any election held in America was required under the Act, to have documents pertaining to the November 2020 Presidential election.

Therefore, the Trump Administration is not entitled to these records. To the extent Fulton County even retains these records, it is not because of the Civil Rights Act or any other federal requirement, but because county - not national - retention is. These records are neither an Fulton County's own administrative records. These records are outside the ambit of the Attorney General's authority under the Civil Rights Act.

This letter is respectfully outside of the rule of law and ready to support. The Trump Administration must voluntarily submit it.

Legal assistance: This week, I successfully represented yet another constituent – with fully legal immigration status – pro bono in traffic court with minor infractions, simply to ensure they were not picked up by ICE in jail. Even though this issue may be getting less attention, it is def. still happening. These experiences also inspired my introduction of HB 1518 this past session, which extends time by which those who don't show up in traffic court – frequently because of changed notices they never received (like in my experience representing another constituent).



Last Word: More Successes

Memory screening/older adults wellness event: Our second annual memory screening/older adults health event saw nearly double what we saw last year, at over 70 patients, from a range of cultural and linguistic backgrounds and particularly targeting our diverse AAPI populations (coinciding with AAPI Heritage Month). Thank you to constant partners Dr. Kim/Community Resource Corporation and Dr. Parker/Emory Alzheimer's Disease Research Center. PSA we always repeat: Fact: some memory loss is normal with aging, but significant memory loss is not.



Food drive: Thank you to Brookside Green, for hosting a food drive for Meadowcreek cluster with Comm'r Ku and me! Beyond an initiative on food security, we also got to brainstorm around community concerns, like we recently did to have the nearby Live Oak sidewalks repaired.



Policy AND Program Successes: I'm most proud of my constituent services and the local programs I've created. I'm most proud of bringing programs here via the nonprofit I created, Lucky Shoals – inc. the 20M dol. EPA grant for Norcross I'm now fighting the Trump Admin to restore; PRIVATELY funding lighting at Osborne, Dawson, & Old Norcross-Tucker; & building a bus shelter @ Nett. We work w/county, but ALSO fund our OWN projects.

But knowing what's happening on the ground then feeds directly into my extensive policy work. Across federal, state, and local governments - and across legislative, executive (so many state agencies!), and judicial branches - I've worked to effect policy change, justifying the 3/4 of the year when we're not in legislative session:

Federal:

- worked with CDC (Biden Admin) to update adult vaccine schedule in non-English languages
- sued Trump Admin after illegal DOGE termination of \$20 million Environmental Protection Agency grant Marvin got for Norcross + helped other entities affected by grant cuts to file suit

State:

- passed 2 bills (re: road safety, indigenous Americans) + have had hearings on over 20 bills (most of any Democrat since 2021)
- introduced other policies that are now law: 1) transfer-on-death deed; 2) minority/women/veteran-owned small business tax credit "fix"; 3) data collection on claims re: Stand Your Ground
- secured funding in state budget for: 1) UGA Small Business Development Center's multilingual programming; 2) additional public defender and assistant district attorney for Gwinnett
- worked with Criminal Justice Coordinating Council to permit use of crime victims funds by survivors with insurance, but not primary policyholder (who are often perpetrator)
- co-designed "Cultural Adeptness" course for Georgia Public Safety Training Center (now taken by thousands of POST-certified law enforcement)
- advocated Ga Dep't of Agriculture to permit "water spinach" use (important for Asian and other cuisine)
- worked with Dep't of Community Affairs to update and, for first time, translate GA Landlord-Tenant Handbook
- worked with Dep't of Education to update and, for first time, translate "Operation Stop Arm" materials re: stopping for school buses
- advocated Insurance Commissioner to track denial of coverage for care after self-harm ("source exclusion")
- worked with Dep't of Human Services to implement constituent feedback re: Gateway (system to access SNAP/TANF/etc. application)
- secured official guidance from Board of Regents re: applicability of in-state tuition for Afghan/Ukrainian refugees
- co-created "Georgia State Parks and Historic Sites Art Contest" w/ Dep't of Natural Resources

Local:

- advocated for Gwinnett County Public Schools changes to: 1) residency affidavit; 2) school-level budgeting policies
- advocated Gwinnett County budget to: 1) restore indigent medical care funding in 2022; 2) reject funding for fake pregnancy clinics (successfully at least for 2 years); 3) fund perinatal program/Healthy Mothers, Healthy Babies; 4) fund disABILITY LINK (latter two orgs I convinced to apply in Gwinnett); 5) permit ARPA funding to go to programs serving undocumented people
- advocated for Gwinnett County ordinance changes re: 1) gas station rezonings in C-1/2s; 2) multifamily interior code enforcement; 3) nighttime establishments in commercial zones near housing; 4) speed hump petition process (not to disfavor renters)
- advocated Gwinnett County Planning & Development re: use of GIS to locate local zoning cases

Rep. Marvin Lim's Policy Successes

Federal:

- trabajó con los CDC (Administración de Biden) para actualizar el calendario de vacunas para adultos en idiomas que no son inglés
- demandó a la Administración Trump después de la terminación ilegal por parte de DOGE de una subvención de \$20 millones de la Agencia de Protección Ambiental. Marvin obtuvo para Norcross + ayudó a otras entidades afectadas por los recortes de subvenciones a presentar demandas



Estatat:

- aprobó 2 proyectos de ley (sobre seguridad vial, americanos indígenas) + tuvo audiencias sobre más de 20 proyectos de ley (la mayoría de los cuales son demócratas desde 2021)
- introdujo otras políticas que ahora son ley: 1) transferencia tras muerte, 2) crédito fiscal para pequeñas empresas propiedad de minorías/mujeres/veteranos, 3) cobro de mora en reclamaciones: De Pie por tu Derecho
- aseguró financiamiento en el presupuesto estatal para: 1) programas multilingües del Centro de Desarrollo de Pequeñas Empresas de UGA; 2) defensor público adicional y fiscal auxiliar para el condado de Gwinnett
- trabajó con el Consejo de Coordinación de Justicia Criminal para permitir el uso de fondos de víctimas de delitos para sobrevivientes con seguro, pero no para el agresor principal (quien a menudo es el perpetrador)
- co-diseñó el curso de "Aptitud Cultural" para el Centro de Capacitación en Seguridad Pública de Georgia (ahora tomado por miles de empleados certificados POST)
- abogó por que el Depto. de Agricultura permita el "berro de agua" (importante para la cocina asiática y de otros países)
- trabajó con el Depto. de Asuntos Comunitarios para actualizar y, por primera vez, traducir el Manual para Propietarios e Inquilinos de GA
- trabajó con el Depto. de Educación para actualizar y, por primera vez, traducir los materiales de "Operación Brazo Contra" (para detener a los conductores de autobús escolar)
- abogó ante el Comisionado de Seguros para dar seguimiento a las denegaciones de cobertura por atención tras autolesiones ("exclusión de fuente")
- trabajó con el Depto. de Servicios Humanos para implementar la retroalimentación de los constituyentes: Gateway (sistema para acceder a SNAP/TANF, etc. por solicitud)
- aseguró orientación oficial de la Junta de Regentes sobre: elegibilidad para matrícula dentro del estado para refugiados afganos/ucranianos
- co-creó el "Concurso de Arte de Parques Estatales de Georgia y Sitios Históricos" con el Depto. de Recursos Naturales



Local:

- abogó por cambios en las Escuelas Públicas del Condado de Gwinnett para: 1) comprobante de residencia, 2) políticas presupuestarias a nivel escolar
- abogó por un presupuesto del Condado de Gwinnett para: 1) restaurar fondos para atención médica indígena en 2022; 2) rechazar fondos para clínicas de embarazo (exitosamente al menos por 2 años); 3) financiar programas perinatales/ Madres Saludables, Bebés Saludables; 4) financiar disability LINK (tras convencer a dos organizaciones de aplicar en Gwinnett); 5) permitir fondos ARPA para programas que atienden a personas sin estatus migratorio
- abogó por cambios en la ordenanza del condado de Gwinnett sobre: 1) re zonificación de estaciones de gasolina en C-1/2s; 2) cumplimiento multifamiliar de códigos interiores; 3) establecimientos nocturnos en zonas comerciales cerca de vivienda; 4) proceso de petición de reductores de velocidad (no para desalojar inquilinos)
- abogó por el Plan Integral del Condado de Gwinnett y Desarrollo: uso del SIG para localizar casos de zonificación local

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
