## Primary Election Date Reminder: May 19, 2026

### Taking Action

**Encampments:** Related to HB 295, I worked to engage and resolve issues surrounding two encampments in our area on Harbins and Williams. Four things of note: 1) non-present private property owners were neglecting their properties, to everyone's detriment – indicative of a larger problem that touches every form of housing and property; 2) encampments can become dangerous for all; 3) extensive, repeated outreach (and in-language), as we did here, is both necessary and critical, to meet people where they are, because homelessness takes many unique forms, and simply displacing people (inc. to another, new encampment) will not resolve the larger issues; 4) it is clear there are simply not enough resources out there, whether permanent supportive housing, accessible, jobs, etc. We need to push for more, which is why I wrote the AJC op-ed in December for Gwinnett to access more federal CoC dollars for homelessness. Ultimately, in light of the tragedy that happened with Cornelius Taylor in Atlanta, we also need at the very least to proactively establish guidelines for addressing encampments (e.g., Benioff Homelessness & Housing Initiative Encampment Resolution Guide). ## Rep. Marvin Lim Partners with DCA to Provide Georgia Landlord-Tenant Handbook Translations

ATLANTA – State Representative Marvin Lim (D-Norcross) today announces that he has partnered with the Department of Community Affairs (DCA) to provide language translations of the Georgia Landlord-Tenant Handbook.

“I am excited to have worked with the Department of Community Affairs to update and then—for the first time—provide translations for their incredibly critical Landlord-Tenant Handbook,” said Rep. Lim. “I am also thankful for the partnership with the UGA School of Law, the Georgia State University’s Center for Access to Justice and the Latino Community Fund for working with me to make this happen. We in the General Assembly have taken important steps in terms of landlord-tenant law, such as passage of the Safe at Home Act in 2024, but there is no substitute for people knowing their rights to be able to invoke them. I’m grateful we could take a step toward providing language access for this most-critical resource, for this go around in Spanish, and I look forward to doing more in the future.”

The Georgia Landlord-Tenant Handbook is designed to provide an overview and answer common questions about Georgia residential landlord-tenant law. Online versions are available in both English and in Spanish.



**School funding:** Last year, I requested GCPS to provide more school-level budgeting data and other indicators – because that’s where parents/etc. can really engage. I’m proud then, serving on the new GCPS Policy Committee the last few month, to have successfully pushed to include exactly this in the currently proposed revision to GCPS’s Annual Operating Budget policy. At the state level, while pushing our HB 796 (QBE reform), Reps. Lupton, Wilkerson and I have been attempting to push for the collection of similar data, to help us truly untangle the revenue→expenditure→outcome component of school budgeting (remember to complete our survey at <https://tinyurl.com/fundgaschools>).

### Purpose

In approving the annual budget, the Board seeks to provide the human, physical and fiscal resources to adequately support the vision, mission and strategic goals of Gwinnett County Public Schools ("GCPS").

### Budget Development Process

A first complete draft of the annual budget for the upcoming school year shall be presented in a Board work session no later than March 31<sup>st</sup> of each year. The annual budget shall include but is not limited to the following information:

- Alignment with the forecasts, benchmarking analysis and survey feedback presented to the board previously
- Alignment to the annual goals and strategic priorities of GCPS
  - Investments to improve the academic performance of all students and student subgroups experiencing achievement gaps
- Contingency plans for unexpected unfavorable variances in revenues or unfavorable variances in expenditures.
  - Disaggregated budgets at the school level and prior year revenues and expenses at the school level (aggregate and per pupil dollar amounts), along with student : teacher ratios, student : counselor ratios, student : instructional support position ratios, average teacher salaries, and the percentage of students eligible for free / reduced lunch.

**Rep. Marvin Lim's legislation:** Every session, I'm aggressive in writing and pushing legislation (as well as making budget requests for the district. I've gotten hearings on four bills, moved three bills out of committee (tied for most of any minority party House member), and two total out of the House (same).

# REP. LIM'S 2026 LEGISLATIVE SESSION (AS OF MAR. 7, 2026)

- **HB 641:** expand utility disconnection protections for medically fragile consumers (PASSED OUT OF COMMITTEE)
- **HB 1161:** make traffic stops safer/establish move to the right (PASSED OUT OF HOUSE - NOW IN SENATE)
- **HB 1314:** mandatory disclosure of credit reporting by “Buy Now, Pay Later” lenders (PASSED OUT OF COMMITTEE)
- **HB 673:** expands First Offender Act to more children tried in non-juvenile courts (HEARD IN COMMITTEE)
- **HB 1010:** imposes more duties/liabilities on private equity & private credit
- **HB 1053:** repeal forced local law enforcement-ICE cooperation, requires timely processing of visas for victims of violence
- **budget requests for:** local healthcare workforce training, civil legal services for housing, public defenders, diversion-focused ADAs/solicitors, ESOL teachers, disability-inclusive education

**Utility consumer protections:** Got my second bill out of the House, a piece of consumer protection around utilities: requiring electric suppliers to have a written, available policy on disconnection for residents with serious, life-threatening conditions that could be aggravated by disconnection. Worked hard to bring Georgia Power, EMCs, and municipal electric supplies to the table. Huge thanks to Tina Marsden, who inspired by this bill with her story. I tied this session for both most minority House members that passed a bill out of committee (3) and ultimately out of the House (2).


**Lending consumer protections:** Got my third bill out of committee this session, a consumer protection bill: HB 1314 requires lenders under the Georgia Installment Lending Act – including most “Buy Now, Pay Later” lenders – to tell borrowers if the loans are reportable to credit bureaus. I’ve worked on this issue for a few years now, and am glad to take this next step.

**Loud vehicles:** I am second sponsor on HR 1475, a proposal for a Joint Study Committee on Modified Exhaust Systems on Motor Vehicles.



**Proactive, progressive tax cuts:** Rep Lupton and I have been proud to push HB 930, which would give Georgia residents \$1000 in tax rebates for groceries, utilities, rent and other expenses. When we intro'd it last year we knew it could sound outlandish - until GOP proposed income tax and property tax elimination, which actually are outlandish, i.e., regressive (largely benefiting higher income people already), bankrupting public government services, and possibly leading to inflation. Note also that none of these proposals eliminate huge tax breaks given to those who are already wealthy to begin with - see this spreadsheet I made of our largest tax breaks in Georgia - which these GOP proposals could do if they wanted to pay for these huge tax cuts. Instead, these cuts will provide a couple hundred or thousand to those with less - and only temporarily, because these bills will lead to inflation, while essentially serving as another big tax cut to the wealthiest.

# REPS. LUPTON & LIM'S PROGRESSIVE TAX RELIEF: HB 930

- **\$1,000 YEARLY, REFUNDABLE INCOME TAX CREDITS FOR GROCERIES:** plus utilities & rent, transportation (i.e., many expenses not covered by federal EITC, which itself does not exist at GA state level)
- **WORKFORCE TRAINING COURSE TAX CREDITS:** tailored to local needs/opportunities (i.e., not limited to USG/TCSG offerings)
- **TAX CREDITS FOR CIVIL LEGAL SERVICE PROVIDERS** in underserved areas (e.g., for housing, family law, etc.)
- **LOW INCOME HOUSING TAX CREDIT:** for building affordable housing projects that are competitive, but crowded out to qualify for federal LIHTC

### Rep. Lim Statement on HR 1114 & HB 1116 (Property Tax Elimination)

HR 1114 and HB 1116 have been branded as homeownership opportunity legislation. In considering this legislation, then, it is important to ask: how much will this solve the problem of unaffordable homeownership? Property taxes *have* become too high. But are property taxes the primary problem with unaffordable homeownership, or even the second or third biggest problem? After all, property *taxes* are only getting higher because property *values* are getting higher without commensurate increases in income or liquid wealth to be able to pay those taxes. So what is causing this phenomenon – and can/should we address that instead?

Is the larger, underlying problem, instead of property taxes:

- institutional investors driving up prices?
- small LLCs, who have gotten less attention but own most of the corporately owned housing in my most housing cost burdened part of my county?
- the many barriers create new housing supply – i.e., permitting and bureaucracy issues, the costs of capital and labor to build, the challenge of creating sewer, stormwater, schools, roads, and other infrastructure that will support housing, whether urban, high-density housing, rural workforce housing, or other types of housing?
- the problems with existing housing supply, including out-of-area (often out-of-state) residential property owners that, because of our lack of regulations, are often able to charge *higher* prices for *lower* quality – avoiding internalizing the costs of creating public and private nuisances and blight, and even avoiding tax liens or tax foreclosures for years and engaging in what is essentially arbitrage at the expense of the community?

- our unwillingness to ensure that, when there *are* tax foreclosures, these properties are not just bought by other corporate entities that will drive these prices right back up?
- our unwillingness sufficiently to address:
  - property insurance costs
  - the impact of HOAs
  - the costs of utilities
  - the costs of upkeep/repair/modifications to age-in-place, or
  - any number of other issues that are driving up the costs of homeownership?

I frequently say: we all want affordable livable housing – but this is NOT a policy platform. There is no shortcut to achieving this goal; it requires people on both sides of the aisle – and across our local, state and federal governments – to come up with solutions that are not so simplistic, yet that do not have the problems of HR 1114 and HB 1116.

I am not saying we should avoid addressing the problem of first-time homebuyers being priced out, or keeping longtime homeowners in their homes – seniors, veterans, etc. I have frequently pushed homestead exemptions: my first year, I proposed a low-income homestead exemption for Gwinnett County (and I was not the first – Athens Clarke did it first). And, like most of my colleagues – Democrats and Republicans – I have supported local homestead exemption after local homestead exemption in my six years in office.

Paying one to several thousand dollars a year in property taxes – that absolutely matters. What I fear though is that, without addressing the root causes of our housing affordability crisis, the few thousand dollars a year in savings from HR 1114/HB 1116 will remain hypothetical for most, washed away by the fact that housing prices will *still* rise – not by a few thousand, but by tens, even hundreds of thousands, leaving many would-be first-time home buyers *still* unable to buy and long-time homeowners *still* unable to stay in their homes (or ever move), given the much-larger parts of rising homeownership costs that we remain unwilling to address.

Regardless of the ultimate result of this legislation, I hope we can come together and actually tackle the many, *many* aspects that go into why our housing costs – not just property taxes – are, in fact, so high.

And per my analysis of HB 1116 – a very-rushed bill that, in lieu of eliminating property taxes, has very unclear benefits and complicated revenue-raising mechanisms.

# GA HOUSE GOP'S (CONFUSING) PROPERTY TAX BILL: HB 1116

- **very unclear savings to any specific resident:** does not eliminate property taxes (after failure of earlier HR 1114), but attempts to restrict ad valorem property tax revenue increases at higher of 3 %/yr or inflation rate
- **permits complex mechanisms to adjust local states tax** to make up revenue difference
- **rushed:** proposal provided to House only hours before Crossover Day deadline
- **violates Georgia Constitution**, which requires constitutional amendment to change ad valorem property tax rates



**Sports gambling:** When we consider sports betting, we must be honest with ourselves: we are not just legalizing and taxing what people are “already doing,” but opening the world to an exponential increase in participants – many of whom MUST be addicted for the industry to succeed. We are not engaging in harm-reduction, unlike with marijuana decrim; we are using a shortcut to revenue, at the expense of our youth. I made these points in my speech on HR 450, another rushed proposal on sports betting.

**SNAP:** In Nov. 2025, I not only donated \$20K to replace Norcross residents' lost SNAP benefits given the freeze (<https://85cdc.org/snap>), but also called for an audit of our SNAP program in the wake of H.R. 1 - not to eliminate imaginary consumer fraud, but so we can find actual savings from administration to deliver back to residents already struggling. Unfortunately, our General Assembly is going in the wrong direction, attempting to pass HB 947, which could actually worsen our SNAP error rates (which are largely ADMINISTRATION errors, including UNDERpayments to beneficiaries). I spoke out against HB 947, and, while we did not defeat it, I was told by at least one majority-party colleague that I changed their vote to NO.

# Speaking against HB 947 (reducing SNAP access)



**Medicaid:** Along the same subject, this week, we did defeat a bill – HB 1276 – that attempts to reduce Medicaid errors (almost all Medicaid fraud is by providers, btw, not recipients) by: 1) removing critical means of eligibility verification for those who have the most need, 2) not providing any clear funding for agencies (who already struggle) to do this work. These are points I made in Health Committee, where I motioned for us to table the bill until we had an actual fiscal note; ultimately, the bill passed. 




